Thematic

This term our topic begins with 'Let's Play' - where the children will be given exciting opportunities to learn about toys past and present. We move on to 'Jurassic World' Our learning takes place through a mix of adult-led and child-initiated sessions indoors and outdoors. The children quide our learning wherever possible.



Personal, Social and Emotional Development/PSHE Through PSHE lessons and all areas of the Early Years curriculum, children will develop their skills surrounding making relationships, self-confidence, awareness and managing their feelings and behaviour.

Communication and Language

Through all areas of the curriculum, children will develop their speaking, listening, attention and understanding skills.



Literacy

Children will continue to develop their phonic knowledge through the scheme 'Floppy's Phonics'. They will build on their learning last term to recognise initial, medial and final sounds to use this to segment and blend CVC words. They will learn to write short phrases and sentences and will practise recognising the written form of sounds within words. This learning will be reenforced though home reading, your child will continue to take home reading books appropriate to their ability and we would encourage you to read a variety of books with your child.

Subitising is when you are able to look at a group of objects and realise how many there are without counting and we shall be exploring this skill though child initiated, and teacher led activities.
